Faculty Success: Fixes to our review, promotion, and tenure (portfolio) system

Faculty Success, formerly known as Digital Measures, is software that allows faculty to keep track of their research, teaching, and research activities and generate reports. This year, we've made some improvements. What you can expect for Fall review:

- · When you generate a report, instead of downloading it and emailing it to the review committee, you will click "submit" and it will go into a traditional online workflow. Users now have access only to their own accounts without exception.
- Course evaluations are now directly integrated, making it possible to add them to
- your report without downloading it and uploading it again. Additional reporting capabilities for Chairs and administrators.
